## Community Volunteers

Community Volunteers promote Heifer through educational presentations and fundraising activities across the United States. The support of individuals, schools, faith communities, clubs and other organizations is vital to Heifer's work. In order to build and maintain meaningful relationships with these supporters, Heifer needs the help of Community Volunteers. Creative, self-directed individuals are needed to represent Heifer's mission to the public.



### Some things you can do:

- ☛ Staff a display at a conference, county fair or alternative gift market. Heifer can provide attractive display boards and printed materials to distribute.
- ☛ Give a presentation to a local school, congregation or civic group. Help spread the word about Heifer's sustainable solution to hunger and poverty.
- ☛ Bring people together for a dinner, benefit or other event.
- ☛ Be an Area Volunteer Coordinator for Heifer in your city or state. Recruit and enlist new volunteers. Arrange programs for local congregations, schools or civic groups.



## Learning Center Volunteers

Heifer International's Learning Centers deliver educational programs showcasing Heifer's model for global sustainable development. Learning Center Volunteers are an integral part of presenting Heifer's mission to the public and exploring issues of world hunger and poverty while challenging visitors to become more responsible global citizens. Heifer has positions for both residential and day volunteers. Residential volunteers are provided on-site housing at Learning Centers and work full-time; all residential volunteers must be at least 18 years old. Day volunteers can serve either full-time or part-time and the minimum age varies based on location and duties.

### Residential and day volunteers will work in a variety of areas at the Learning Centers such as:

- Lead Educational Programming
- Tend the Gardens\*
- Care for Livestock\*
- Provide Administrative Support
- Assist with Special Events
- Maintain Facilities\*
- Greet Visitors at the Front Desk
